(March 8, 1973 - September 4, 2017)

It is with great sadness that we mark the passing of Dana Mallory. Dana was an active member of RPTA, serving on the Executive Board and the Young Artists committee. She was also a dear friend to many in our organization.

Born in Endicott, NY, Dana resided in the Cary area for over 30 years. She received her Bachelor's degree from the College of Charleston and her Master's from UNC Greensboro. She recently successfully defended her dissertation thru Boston University.

Dana's life was truly focused on teaching her piano students and guiding the Youth Band at Christ The King Lutheran Church in Cary. It gave her great joy to interact with and mentor students.

She is survived by parents John and Ilse Mallory, sister and brother-in-law Kara and Philip Larson, 7 Aunts and Uncles, and 9 cousins. The childhood gatherings with her cousins kept them close in adulthood.
